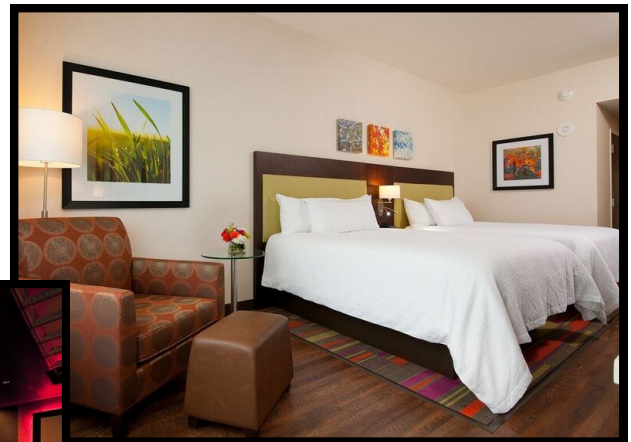

Pittsburgh Historical Facts:

- Pittsburgh was named in 1758 by General John Forbes, in honor of British statesman William Pitt, 1st Earl of Chatham.
- Pittsburgh has 446 bridges, and with its proximity to three major rivers and countless hills and ravines, Pittsburgh is known as "The City of Bridges" (more bridges than Venice!).
- In 1961, the Civic Arena, the world's first civic auditorium with a retractable roof, opened.
- In 1992, the world-class Pittsburgh International Airport opened.
- The Duquesne Incline opened to public on May 20, 1877. It has also been counted as one of "14 Fabulous Funiculars from Around the Globe" by Mother Nature Network.
- Andy Warhol was an American artist, born and raised in Pittsburgh, was a director and producer who was a leading figure in the visual art movement known as pop art.
- Andrew Carnegie led the expansion of the American steel industry in the late 19th Century.
- Kennywood is an amusement park that first opened as a "trolley park" attraction at the end of the on May 30, 1899.
- John Campbell and Thomas Vickroy, while creating the city block plan for streets in Pittsburgh's core, created Market Square in 1764. It was known originally as "Diamond Square" or "Diamond Market" for the Scotch-Irish idiom "Diamond" representing a public commons or square.
