Enjoy entertainment and a behind the scenes tour at The State Theatre, an original vaudeville house in the heart of historic Uniontown.

Have a seat for dinner and drinks at Caporella's Restaurant, a dining experience, in a historic train station.

Arrive at Christian W Klay Winery, and enjoy a vineyard tour, wine tasting, and lunch in a historic barn.

Stop at Fort Necessity National Battlefield, one of the most famed sights along the National Road and where George Washington lost his first battle.

Tour Frank Lloyd Wright's Kentuck Knob, enjoy this fully guided tour highlighted with famous furniture designs, beautiful views, and gorgeous natural scenery.

Stop at the Stone House Restaurant for a dinner in a historic inn that has served the National Road for decades.

Visit Ohio State Park and the Laurel Highlands Falls Area Visitors Center where you'll learn about the National Road.
