


DAY 1

Start your Pittsburgh trip with a 'Burgh Bits and Bites Walking Food Tour. During this two-hour tour, you'll learn about one of Pittsburgh's 90 neighborhoods, the historic international food area, the Strip District. Come hungry, you'll be tasting the whole way!

After your food tour concludes, visit the nearby Senator John Heinz History Center, a Smithsonian affiliate. Here, you can learn about the history of Southwestern Pennsylvania, check out the Western Pennsylvania Sports Museum, stop by an exhibit on Mister Rogers, and Heinz Ketchup.





DAY 1

This evening, visit Station Square along one of our three rivers, the Monongahela. Ride the Duquesne Incline to the top of Mt. Washington for sweeping views of the city. Did you know that Pittsburgh has 446 bridges? Count as many as you can see!

Station Square offers many dining options for dinner including a dinner cruise on the river with the Gateway Clipper Fleet, Buca di Beppo, and the Hard Rock Café.



This morning, head over to the National Aviary, a free-standing bird zoo. Want to get a closer look at our feathered friends? The Aviary offers a variety of experiences to get up-close-and-personal, some of which are complimentary. Check out the daily schedule of shows, feedings and encounters.

Enjoy lunch at one of the many Eat 'n Park locations, offering an American diner experience. Don't forget to try the signature Smiley Cookie!



DAY 2

This afternoon, venture out to Carrie Blast Furnaces, the only non-operative furnaces remaining in Pittsburgh, and one of only two such sites you can tour in the country. Rivers of Steel Heritage Tours takes you behind-the-scenes with either an industrial or art-focused tour. Groups can arrange special experiences including a graffiti workshop.

Continue down the Monogahela river to Kennywood Amusement Park for the evening. With many dining and entertainment options to suit everyone, be sure to check out the infamous Potato Patch Fries and the new Steelers Country, featuring the Steel Curtain roller coaster!

DAY 3

As your visit to Pittsburgh concludes, consider a shopping stop this morning. Out-of-state guests will enjoy a clothing and shoes tax-free shopping spree at Ross Park Mall or The Mall at Robinson. Just off of I-79 South are the Tanger Outlets, where you'll find a variety of discount, brand name merchandise.
