The city of Pittsburgh is easily accessible from all major highways in Southwestern PA.


Come for an afternoon or stay the night. Here are some ideas for a quick stop.

Escape the ordinary in <u>Pittsburgh's Cultural District</u>. There is something for all groups, including dinner shows at Greer Cabaret, awe inspiring entertainment at one of the historic theaters, and even magic! Liberty Magic is a 66-seat venue dedicated to the art of magic- it's easy to add a performance to fit your group itinerary.

Hotel partners in the Cultural District include <u>Courtyard by Marriott</u>

<u>Pittsburgh Downtown</u> and <u>Drury Plaza Hotel Pittsburgh Downtown</u>.

- → Enjoy lunch and a sightseeing cruise aboard one of <u>The Gateway</u> <u>Clipper Fleet's</u> three vessels or <u>Rivers of Steel's</u> Explorer riverboat.
- Take in a panoramic view of Pittsburgh on the iconic <u>Duquesne Incline</u>. After, dine at <u>Hard Rock Café Pittsburgh</u>, conveniently located near the foot of the incline. Spend the night with a view of the river at <u>Sheraton</u> <u>Pittsburgh Hotel at Station Square</u> before heading on your way.
- Make your stop in Pittsburgh one for the history books. The <u>Fort Pitt Museum</u>, located in picturesque Point State Park, tells the story of "The Point's" role in two wars, shaping the city. Boxed lunches can be delivered by <u>Gaetano's Catering and Event Center</u> for a picnic lunch. Head to the <u>Senator John Heinz History Center</u>, which explores more than 250 years of Western Pennsylvania's history.
- Take a guided sightseeing tour of the city with Molly's Trolleys or customize your tour with Passport to Pittsburgh.
- Stretch your legs and your taste buds with a 'Burgh Bits and Bites Food Tour. Stop into visit with local business owners, learn the history of our neighborhoods, and delight in samples from each stop.
- →Explore the Strip District and stop by **2420 Penn Ave** for an axe-throwing or escape room adventure. So much fun you won't want to "escape."
- → Lions, Tigers and Murals? Make a stop at the <u>Pittsburgh Zoo and</u> <u>Aquarium</u>. On your way stop in the Millvale neighborhood to see **The Vanka Murals** at St. Nicholas Church
- Breakfast is for the birds or is it with the birds? Your group can have both at the <u>National Aviary!</u> The largest Aviary in the country.
